

CERTIFICATE IN MINISTRY COURSE CURRICULUM (30 HOURS)

This is a six months' course designed to prepare an assistant pastor for ministry. The graduate will also help the youth ministry grow to the next level. It is a startup course towards a diploma level education. Required qualification is basic knowledge in Bible and an English language proficiency.

LDP 101	CHURCH LEADERSHIP I	3	The student at the end of the course will have the basic knowledge of how to lead a church or organization based on biblical principles.
RES 102	RESURRECTION	3	The basis of the Christian faith is founded on Jesus resurrection. The course focuses on biblical teachings and the worldview on Jesus earthly life.
CP 103	CHURCH POLITICS	3	Does the Bible have politics? How can politics benefit the church and how negative politics divide the church? The student will at the end of the course be able to contain divisive politics and organize a system that is united.

DIPLOMA IN MINISTRY AND PASTORAL WORK COURSE CURRICULUM (67 CREDIT HOURS).

It is a two-year program designed to prepare students as pastors of local churches. A candidate is allowed to transfer credits of up to 20% from a recognized institution or the equivalent. An English language proficiency is required. A minimum of C- from high school is also a requirement for admission. Mature entry is accepted as deemed by the senate committee.

B.Th. (SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY OPTION) CURRICULUM (120 CREDIT HOURS).

A 4 years Bachelor Degree Course program. Required qualification of admission are, an English proficiency and a minimum of a C in high school or the equivalent or a Diploma from any recognized Bible College.

This course is designed to prepare students for a Master’s degree. The graduates can serve as pastors or teach in high schools.
